


Part I. Aggravating Factors

1. The defendant, Gurmeet Singh Dhinsa, procured the commission of the offenses by payment, or promise of payment, of a thing of pecuniary value.




2. The defendant, Gurmeet Singh Dhinsa, committed the offenses after substantial planning and pre-meditation to cause the death of the victim.






